
Quilt Shop Spinner Instructions designed by Judy Ferguson



- 1. Glue the four posts together as shown in the top view.
- 2. Glue the wood panels to the post assembly as shown in the top view drawing, with the top of the panels flush with the top of the posts.
- 3. Glue the "pegboard" panels to the wood panels. There should be about 1/16" of the wood panel showing on the top, bottom and outer edges.
- 4. Drill a hole in the center of the base to accommodate the short piece of brass tubing and glue the tubing into the base. It should fit very snugly.
- 5. Glue the long piece of tubing into the long one.
- 6. Slip the completed post and panel assembly over the brass tubing. It should rest on top of the short piece of tubing. If it slips down too far, glue a sliver of wood in the hole in the center of the post. Don't glue the tube in if you want it to spin freely.
- 6.Glue a hat pin or a bead on the top sticking the pin down the tube
- 7. Shorten straight or sequin pins to about 3/16", drill small holes where desired in the pegboard, and glue the pins in for peg hooks.

Note: I used plastic canvas from Michael's that is close to scale for pegboard, or perf board from Radio Shack could be used. I used K & S brass tubing 1/8", and another piece of tubing that would slip into it.
